Twin Brothers and Soup

As you eat your soup, help each other retell the rest of the story. What is a birthright and why did Jacob want it? Was it good for Jacob to ask for it in exchange for soup? Why do you think Esau sold his birthright for soup? Was that a wise decision for Esau?
