

The five lists in the New Testament are of the ways the Spirit might gift a community.
Definitions of Gifts in Scripture

Prophecy: the ability to speak a word in alignment with God's kingdom (Acts 15:32)
Pastoring: the ministry of overseeing someone's spiritual wellbeing (1 Timothy 3:1-7)
Teaching: the activity of communicating and explaining subjects and relevant matters to others (Romans 12:7)
Wisdom: the embracing and implementation of God's ways in actions, deed, and decisions (1 Cor. 2:1-13)
Knowledge: the activity of discovering, accumulating, analyzing, and clarifying ideas & concepts (Col. 2:2-3)
Evangelist: the ministry of participating in God's work to bring all of humanity in oneness with God (2 Tim 4:5)
Exhortation: the ministry of providing comfort, healing, or encouragement (Hebrews 10:25)
Discerning of Spirits: the activity of identifying the source or heart of someone's intentions (Acts 5:1-11)
Giving: the activity to liberally contribute resources for the common good (2 Cor 8:1-7)
Helps: the ability to enable others or increase someone else's ministry or activity (Rom 16:1-2)
Mercy: the activity of lavishing empathy and compassion upon others to reveal God (Matt 20:29-34)
Missionary: the gift of translating or ministering to a culture outside one's own experience (Acts 8:4)

Hospitality: the activity of expressing others are welcome and belong to a community or region (Acts 16:14-15)

Faith: the activity of confidently encouraging others about the presence of God (1 Cor. 12:9)
Leadership: the ministry of being able to envision and direct others to a common goal (Acts 15:7-11)
Miracles: the ability to participate with God in outlandish ways to reveal God to the world (2 Cor. 12:12)
Healing: the gift of restoring hurt, damage, or exhaustion to the world from God's own strength (Acts 3:1-10)
<u>Tongues</u> : the gift of communicating a divine message on behalf of God to the community of God in a unique way (1 Cor 14:13-19)
Interpretation of Tongues: gift of accurately translating tongues (1 Cor 14:13)
Voluntary Poverty: the activity of renouncing material comfort in order to serve God (2 Cor 6:10)
Celibacy: the activity of remaining single in order to serve God more freely (1 Cor 7:7-8)
Intercession: to spiritually step into one's life or situation and lift them before God (Luke 22:41-44)
Deliverance: the gift of casting out manifestations or intentions of evil (Acts 8:5-8)
Service: the activity of meeting unmet needs according to the necessities of a community (Galatians 6:2)
Worship: the ministry of bringing hearts to the throne of God (1 Samuel 16:25)




